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1. **Executive Summary.**

- a) **Executive Summary:** MIDAP's main objective is to generate scientific knowledge based on a multidimensional understanding of depression in interaction with personality, and to maximize the effectiveness of interventions in prevention, psychotherapy, and rehabilitation. In its ninth year of operation, MIDAP's scientific team includes over 200 researchers, students, collaborators, and technicians who belong to its six host institutions as well as to other Chilean and foreign institutions. We summarize the scientific activity of MIDAP that was organized around four basic lines of research.

L1: Basic structures and bio-psycho-social processes. During 2022 the scientific activity in Line 1 continued to uncover disease mechanisms, conducting basic psychological research, understanding risk factors, and developing instrumentation for local use. Within L1, mental health and COVID-19 studies continued during 2022, with new publications and new studies. During 2022, Line 1 continues to produce sound basic research considering each specific etiopathogenic level, making progress in understanding how genetic determinants, biomarkers, psychological and interpersonal variables are associated - and interact - with depressive symptomatology, clinical depression, personality dysfunction, suicidality, and subjective well-being. We have continued to introduce modern technology in early screening and intervention.

Longitudinal studies. During 2022 MIDAP continued to invest in research modules concerning depression in major longitudinal studies being currently conducted in Chile.

L2: Health promotion and psychosocial prevention. Line 2 continued to provide during 2022 good coverage regarding health promotion and prevention across the life span with increased scientific activities focusing on older persons. An emphasis on internet-based interventions continues to be present which presents with significant benefits in terms of coverage and dissemination. A focus on parental sensitivity, mentalization and coparenting has been further developed during 2022. The work with caregivers, including teachers of pre-school children also appears to be a promising area to protect the mental health of children.

L3: Psychotherapeutic interventions and change processes. During 2022, Line 3 continued to concentrate a significant proportion of MIDAP's scientific efforts and scientific output. From effectiveness outcome research to studies focusing on micro processes of discourse-voice regulation, L3 provides a broad set of projects which have supplied findings that contribute significantly to understand mechanisms involved in psychotherapeutic change. An enhanced focus on personality dysfunction can be identified in scientific output during 2022 as well as interesting findings regarding potential epigenetic modifications during psychotherapy.

L4: Mitigation of Chronicity in the Course of Depression. Focus on chronicity and recovery continued to be developed within Line 4, and during 2022 most progress was seen around the role of chronic health conditions on treatment response to anti-depressive interventions as well as treatment adaptations and innovations to optimize treatment results for this group of patients.

Productivity: During the reported period, 145 scientific documents were published, more than any previous year. Publications include 114 articles, 4 books, and 27 book chapters. With respect to scientific articles, 104 (70.3%) were published in journals indexed in *Web of Science/SCOPUS*. Of these 104 articles, 23 (22.1%) were published in Q1 and 24 (23.1%) in Q2 journals. When looking at publications by line of research, most publications originated from L1 (56.6%) followed by L2 (25.5%), L3 (17.2%) and L4 (0.01%). A substantial part of the publications of the Institute continued to be collaborative, and we will continue to encourage associative scientific work and publishing between researchers. Students were part of 32 of these publications. Also, 52.4% of the articles published during 2022 Young Researchers or Postdoctoral Researchers as co-authors. One hundred and thirty-eight presentations were

delivered, which signals an 33% increase from last year. Of these presentations, 58% of them were delivered physically or virtually in international venues.

Education, Training and Capacity Building: During 2022, MIDAP added 39 new young people, reaching the figure of 267 young trainees since its beginning. Specifically, MIDAP has hosted 43 undergraduate students, 97 master's students, 91 doctoral students, and 14 Postdoctoral Researchers (PR). To date, 129 students have graduated with their studies or theses under the guidance of MIDAP researchers: 42 PhDs, 79 master's degrees and 8 undergraduate degrees. Furthermore, 22 Young Researchers (YR) have been part of MIDAP during these years. This large overall figure reflects young people's interest in joining MIDAP, since they regard it as a center of excellence relevant to their careers.

Networking. During 2022, MIDAP continues to consolidate its international footprint, maintaining and strengthening many of its international networks, even though international travel remained difficult due to the COVID-19 pandemic. As reported previously, international (and national) research networks were developed and/or further consolidated on MIDAP's traditional topics.

Outreach and Connections: During 2022, MIDAP continued to strengthen its position as a serious and trustworthy source of information on mental health topics, with an emphasis on depression and personality functioning. Nine years of high-quality research in this field have produced a body of scientific evidence that lends MIDAP researchers the credence required to inform society. For this reason, MIDAP professionals were permanently asked to provide their authoritative voice as mental health experts, leading to over 90 registered media appearances this year. CNN Chile's SanaMente concentrated most of these appearances. It is also worth noting that MIDAP has 11,661 followers on Facebook, 5,247 on Instagram, 1,923 on Twitter, and 1,249 on LinkedIn, as well as 2,740 YouTube subscribers.

Administration and Financial Status: All the administrative tasks and internal meetings of the MIDAP Institute continued to be held remotely throughout 2022. The Institute received the full payment of its ninth financial contribution from the MSI by early July 2022 (approx. US\$331,561), a slightly larger amount in Chilean pesos than the previous year, but equivalent to a 13% smaller dollar amount relative to 2021. Additionally, the MSI contributed with US\$ 10,518 for Outreach activities, a 55% budget decrease compared with the funding allocated in 2021. Despite these economic constraints, we were able to maintain most of the planned activities. MIDAP has continued receiving some financial support from ANID (approximately US\$13,786), allocated through FONDECYT for three research projects conducted by MIDAP researchers, together with other grants obtained from various sources, like the funds awarded by Botnar Foundation, Switzerland (US\$ 50,792). In 2022, we received another grant of CLP\$10,000,000 (approx. US\$10,518) from the Vice-President's Office for Research of Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile to support the training of postdoctoral researchers. In addition, we received a payment of US\$ 105,300 for a scientific consultancy commissioned by DUOC, and US\$38,515 for a training consultancy commissioned the Mejor Niñez Service. Finally, we received an additional US\$16,100 from some training programs offered annually by MIDAP. The outflow structure for the year 2022 followed the same pattern of past years, with most of the MSI income being spent on researchers' and students' salaries and bonuses, internal research grants, research assistants' salaries, partial support for publications, and small contributions for attending scientific events, among other elements.

b) Resumen Ejecutivo: El objetivo principal del MIDAP es generar conocimiento científico basado en una comprensión multidimensional de la depresión en interacción con la personalidad, y maximizar la efectividad de las intervenciones en prevención, psicoterapia y rehabilitación. En su noveno año de funcionamiento, el equipo científico del MIDAP incluye a más de 200 investigadores, estudiantes, colaboradores y técnicos que pertenecen a sus seis instituciones anfitrionas, así como a otras instituciones chilenas y extranjeras. Resumimos la actividad científica del MIDAP que se organizó en torno a cuatro líneas básicas de investigación.

L1: Estructuras básicas y procesos bio-psico-sociales. Durante 2022 la actividad científica en la Línea 1 continuó descubriendo mecanismos de enfermedad, realizando investigación psicológica básica, comprendiendo factores de riesgo y desarrollando instrumentación para uso local. Dentro de L1, los estudios sobre salud mental y COVI-19 continuaron durante 2022, con nuevas publicaciones y nuevos estudios. Durante 2022 la Línea 1 continuó produciendo investigación básica sólida considerando cada nivel etiopatogénico específico, avanzando en la comprensión de cómo los determinantes genéticos, los biomarcadores y las variables psicológicas e interpersonales se asocian -e interactúan- con la sintomatología depresiva, la depresión clínica, la disfunción de la personalidad, la suicidalidad y el bienestar subjetivo. Hemos seguido introduciendo tecnología moderna en la detección precoz y la intervención.

Estudios longitudinales. Durante 2022 el MIDAP continuó invirtiendo en módulos de investigación sobre depresión en los principales estudios longitudinales que se realizan actualmente en Chile.

L2: Promoción de la salud y prevención psicosocial. La Línea 2 continuó entregando durante 2022 una buena cobertura respecto de la promoción de la salud y la prevención a lo largo de la vida, con un aumento de las actividades científicas centradas en las personas mayores. Continúa el énfasis en intervenciones basadas en internet, lo que presenta importantes beneficios en términos de cobertura y difusión. Durante 2022 se ha seguido desarrollando un enfoque centrado en la sensibilidad parental, la mentalización y la coparentalidad. El trabajo con los cuidadores, incluidos los profesores de niños en edad preescolar, también parece ser un área prometedora para proteger la salud mental de los niños.

L3: Intervenciones psicoterapéuticas y procesos de cambio. Durante 2022, la Línea 3 siguió concentrando una proporción significativa de los esfuerzos científicos y la producción científica de MIDAP. Desde la investigación de resultados de eficacia hasta estudios centrados en microprocesos de regulación discurso-voz, la L3 ofrece un amplio conjunto de proyectos que han aportado hallazgos que contribuyen significativamente a comprender los mecanismos implicados en el cambio psicoterapéutico. En la producción científica de 2022 se observa una mayor atención a las disfunciones de la personalidad, así como interesantes hallazgos sobre posibles modificaciones epigenéticas durante la psicoterapia.

L4: Mitigación de la cronicidad en el curso de la depresión. El enfoque en la cronicidad y la recuperación continuó desarrollándose dentro de la Línea 4, y durante 2022 la mayor parte del progreso se observó en torno al papel de las condiciones crónicas de salud en la respuesta al tratamiento de las intervenciones antidepresivas, así como las adaptaciones e innovaciones del tratamiento para optimizar los resultados del tratamiento para este grupo de pacientes.

Productividad: Durante el periodo del informe, se publicaron 145 documentos científicos, más que en cualquier año anterior. Las publicaciones incluyen 114 artículos, 4 libros y 27 capítulos de libros. En cuanto a los artículos científicos, 104 (70,3%) se publicaron en revistas indexadas en Web of Science/SCOPUS. De estos 104 artículos, 23 (22,1%) se publicaron en revistas del Q1 y 24 (23,1%) en revistas del Q2. Al examinar las publicaciones por línea de investigación, la mayoría de las publicaciones procedían de L1 (56,6%), seguidas de L2 (25,5%), L3 (17,2%) y L4 (0,01%). Una parte sustancial de las publicaciones del Instituto siguieron siendo en colaboración, y seguiremos fomentando el trabajo científico asociativo y la publicación entre investigadores. Los estudiantes formaron parte de 32 de estas publicaciones. Asimismo, el 52,4% de los artículos publicados durante 2022 tuvieron como coautores a

Jóvenes Investigadores o Investigadores Postdoctorales. Se realizaron 138 presentaciones, lo que supone un incremento del 33% respecto al año pasado. De estas presentaciones, el 58% se realizaron física o virtualmente en sedes internacionales.

Educación, formación y capacitación: Durante 2022, el MIDAP incorporó a 39 nuevos jóvenes, alcanzando la cifra de 267 jóvenes en formación desde sus inicios. En concreto, el MIDAP ha acogido a 43 estudiantes de grado, 97 de máster, 91 de doctorado y 14 Investigadores Postdoctorales (IP). Hasta la fecha, 129 estudiantes se han graduado con sus estudios o tesis bajo la dirección de investigadores del MIDAP: 42 doctorados, 79 másteres y 8 licenciaturas. Además, 22 Jóvenes Investigadores (JI) han formado parte del MIDAP durante estos años. Esta gran cifra global refleja el interés de los jóvenes por formar parte del MIDAP, ya que lo consideran un centro de excelencia relevante para sus carreras.

Redes: Durante 2022, el MIDAP siguió consolidando su huella internacional, manteniendo y reforzando muchas de sus redes internacionales, a pesar de que los viajes internacionales siguieron siendo difíciles debido a la pandemia de COVID-19. Como se reportó en anteriores informes, se desarrollaron y/o consolidaron redes de investigación internacionales (y nacionales) sobre los temas tradicionales del MIDAP.

Divulgación y conexiones: Durante 2022, el MIDAP siguió reforzando su posición como fuente de información seria y fiable sobre temas de salud mental, con especial énfasis en la depresión y el funcionamiento de la personalidad. Nueve años de investigación de alta calidad en este campo han producido un cuerpo de evidencia científica que otorga a los investigadores del MIDAP la credibilidad necesaria para informar a la sociedad. Por esta razón, los profesionales del MIDAP han sido solicitados permanentemente para aportar su voz autorizada como expertos en salud mental, lo que se ha traducido en más de 90 apariciones registradas en los medios de comunicación este año. SanaMente de CNN Chile concentró la mayoría de estas apariciones. Cabe destacar también que el MIDAP cuenta con 11.661 seguidores en Facebook, 5.247 en Instagram, 1.923 en Twitter y 1.249 en LinkedIn, además de 2.740 suscriptores en YouTube.

Administración y situación financiera: Todas las tareas administrativas y las reuniones internas del Instituto MIDAP siguieron celebrándose a distancia a lo largo de 2022.

El Instituto recibió el pago completo de su noveno aporte financiero por parte de la Iniciativa Científica Milenio, ICM, a principios de julio de 2022 (aprox. US\$331.561), monto levemente mayor en pesos chilenos que el año anterior, pero equivalente a un 13% menor en dólares en relación con 2021. Adicionalmente, la ICM contribuyó con US\$ 10.518 para actividades de divulgación, una disminución presupuestaria del 55% en comparación con los fondos asignados en 2021. A pesar de estas limitaciones económicas, hemos podido mantener la mayoría de las actividades previstas. El MIDAP ha continuado recibiendo cierto apoyo financiero de ANID (aproximadamente US\$ 13.786), asignado a través de FONDECYT para tres proyectos de investigación realizados por investigadores del MIDAP, junto con otras subvenciones obtenidas de diversas fuentes, como los fondos otorgados por la Fundación Botnar, Suiza (US\$ 50.792). En 2022, recibimos otra subvención de CLP\$10.000.000 (aprox. US\$10.518) de la Vicerrectoría de Investigación de la Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile para apoyar la formación de investigadores postdoctorales. Además, recibimos un pago de 105.300 US\$ por una consultoría científica encargada por DUOC, y 38.515 US\$ por una consultoría de formación encargada por el Servicio Mejor Niñez. Finalmente, recibimos US\$ 16.100 adicionales por algunos programas de capacitación ofrecidos anualmente por el MIDAP. La estructura de egresos para el año 2022 siguió el mismo patrón de años anteriores, destinándose la mayor parte de los ingresos de la ICM a sueldos y bonificaciones de investigadores y estudiantes, becas internas de investigación, sueldos de asistentes de investigación, apoyo parcial a publicaciones y pequeñas contribuciones para asistencia a eventos científicos, entre otros elementos.

c) **Outstanding Achievements:**

The year 2022 continued to be marked by two events that plunged Chile into a triple crisis: social, political, and public health, namely the social outbreak of October 2019 and the Covid-19 pandemic of March 2020, especially the failed attempt of the Constitutional Convention. This situation kept the levels of uncertainty and stress high in the population and in all national institutions. In this regard, MIDAP's greatest achievement during 2022 was to continue to be able to adapt to the circumstances and to have continued to explore new ways of fulfilling its mission. In this process, MIDAP continued to consolidate itself as a leading Mental Health research center in Chile and Latin America. Simultaneously, during the year 2022, the board of research associates and the management team were engaged in the preparation of the renewal of MIDAP for the next 10-year period. This was a challenge that triggered reflection on what had been the main academic achievements during the whole period and on the need to include more young researchers and to renew the leadership. In this way, a renewed team of researchers was formed and began to design a renewal project to be presented in 2024.

In the academic and scientific area, 145 papers were published, the highest number ever achieved in a single year. Publications include 114 articles published in WoS or Scopus journals, 4 books (2 in Springer), and 27 book chapters. Also noteworthy is the participation and collaboration of several researchers in all publications.

As in other years, some of our members received awards for their contribution to the advancement of our field. Particularly noteworthy is the prize awarded to Dr. Ulises Ríos. In the framework of the Annual Conference of the International Society of Bipolar Disorders (ISBD), held in June 2022, MIDAP Collaborator Researcher Ulises Ríos, from the Department of Psychiatry of the School of Medicine of the University of Valparaíso (one of our host universities) received the "Samuel Gershon Junior Investigator Award", a prestigious award given by this scientific society. The award is given to five internationally outstanding young researchers, based on original studies in the field of mood disorders.

2. Introduction

a) Description of the Institute: The Millennium Institute for Research in Depression and Personality (MIDAP) is a scientific center that hosts researchers from various fields of the social and health sciences. MIDAP's main objective is to generate scientific knowledge based on a multidimensional understanding of depression in interaction with personality. A particular aim of this research agenda is to maximize the effectiveness of interventions through the identification of the agents and mechanisms of change involved in prevention, psychotherapy, and rehabilitation. In its ninth year of operation, MIDAP's scientific team includes over 200 researchers, students, collaborators, and technicians who belong to its six host institutions (Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile [UC], Universidad de Chile [UCH], Universidad del Desarrollo [UDD], Universidad de la Frontera [UFRO], Universidad de Valparaíso [UV]), and Universidad Diego Portales [UDP], as well as to other Chilean and foreign institutions.

MIDAP developed out of the “Psychotherapy and Change Research Group” and the “Psychological Intervention and Change in Depression” Millennium Nucleus. Within the context of these scientific initiatives, a combination of psychological, psychosocial, and psychophysiological approaches to depression were examined and tested. MIDAP has continued employing this multidimensional approach to the study of depression and has also incorporated a differentiated analysis of personality and all the relevant dimensions involved in depression and personality disorders. MIDAP's characteristic multidimensional and multidisciplinary approach is aimed at constructing an empirical model that takes into account the etiology, prevention, intervention, and rehabilitation of depression. This approach addresses the relationship between depression and personality, along with the multiple dimensions of human functioning that have been empirically linked to this disorder. Thus, MIDAP aspires to conduct systematic research on each of these dimensions, which include developmental, cognitive, emotional, and behavioral variables, as well as others of a psychophysiological and genetic nature. MIDAP pursues this multidimensional scientific agenda using a variety of methods and multiple research design and analytic strategies, including cross-sectional, longitudinal, experimental and naturalistic designs, process-and outcome-oriented studies, and quantitative and qualitative data-analytic strategies.

In 2022, most of MIDAP's investigative activities returned to face-to-face mode, preserving the learning and new work methodologies developed in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic. MIDAP continued to play an active role in the media, delivering evidence-based information on mental health relevant to different contexts and age groups in an effort to address needs raised by the public debate. This participation contributed to the dissemination of knowledge among citizens, enriching the reflection on diagnosis and mental health needs in our country. In parallel, MIDAP researchers took part in the editing and authoring of two books: “Etiopathogenic Theories and Models in Depression. Depression and Personality” and “Prevention and Early Treatment of Depression Through the Life Course” (the latter to be published by early 2023). These Springer Collection books provide systematized and thematically organized knowledge on mental health. They also participated in the preparation of a book that compiles evidence-based opinion columns that seek to offer scientifically sound responses to emerging concerns from the public, bringing knowledge closer to non-specialized readers.

During 2022, MIDAP continued to strengthen its international networks focused on depression and personality, the biological and cultural aspects present in the development of psychological disorders, the evolution of depression, the contribution of mindfulness and other contemplative practices, and research in electronic mental health. Numerous scientific publications were produced under the wing of these networks, which also contributed to enrich the training of postgraduate students and young researchers.

b) **Lines of Research:** The scientific activity of MIDAP is organized around four basic lines of research, each of which includes a number of specific studies conducted by interdisciplinary teams of researchers from the fields of psychology, psychiatry, genetics, psychophysiology, neuroscience, anthropology, and sociology (specific studies are presented in chapter 3 of this report and Appendix I). All lines of research include high-level, cutting-edge scientific work that is regularly presented in international conferences and published in peer-reviewed scientific journals:

1. **Basic bio-psycho-social structures and processes.** This line of research focuses on the origins of psychological disorders and the mechanisms whereby they are triggered, developed, and maintained, focusing on depression and personality dysfunction. It assesses multiple cultural, social, developmental, and psychobiological conditions involved in depression and personality. During 2022, this line continued to provide evidence that supports the MIDAP multidimensional model, which considers depression to be nested in personality and influenced by cultural, biological, psychological, and genetic variables. Considering that the best scientific strategies to study the basic components of the etiology, development, maintenance, and worsening of depressive symptomatology include the use of longitudinal research designs, MIDAP has continued working on studies of this type. Specifically, MIDAP has partnered with Research Centers that are carrying out large-scale longitudinal studies. The studies produced in this line were focused on solving scientific problems related to processes as well as biological, psychological, and social structures while also strengthening initiatives aimed at promotion, prevention, and intervention in mental health. Studies in basic psychology were conducted in order to identify the mechanisms of the disease and understand its risk factors, in addition to adapting the evaluation instruments for local use. During this year, studies on mental health and COVID-19 continued to be conducted, which generated new knowledge disseminated through publications.
2. **Health promotion and psychosocial prevention.** This line of research focuses on evaluating the effectiveness of intervention strategies aimed at changing the early conditions associated with the development of depression and personality dysfunction, reducing the social exclusion of people with mental disabilities and enhancing the treatment capacities of mental health professionals. Studies in this line carried out in 2022 continued to provide good coverage in terms of health promotion and prevention over the lifespan, with an increase in scientific activities focused on Internet-based interventions for mental health prevention and in research activities aimed at older people. There is still an emphasis on Internet-based interventions, which exhibit significant benefits in terms of coverage and outreach. A focus on parental sensitivity, mindfulness, and co-parenting has been further developed during 2022, since these components play a key role in promoting social-emotional health and preventing adverse mental health outcomes. Mentalization-based interventions and video feedback continue to show great promise, appearing to be feasible and effective strategies to strengthen social-emotional development in preschool-age children and young children. Working with caregivers, including teachers of preschool-age children, also seems to be a promising area for protecting children's mental health.
3. **Psychotherapeutic interventions and change processes.** This line of research focuses on the analysis of change processes and the effectiveness of psychological interventions. Studies examining change mechanisms and mediation as well as the moderation components of psychological treatments are characteristic of the scientific projects developed within this line of research. As in previous years, this line of research continues to concentrate an important part of the Institute's effort and scientific production. From efficacy outcomes research to studies focused on voice and speech regulation microprocesses, this track comprises a broad set of studies that have greatly improved our comprehension of the underlying mechanisms of psychotherapeutic change. The scientific production of 2022 exhibits a greater focus on personality dysfunction, together with novel findings on possible epigenetic modifications during psychotherapeutic processes.

4. Mitigation of Chronicity in the Course of Depression (previously rehabilitation and reintegration). This line of research focuses on patient recovery and on reducing the chronicity and recurrence of depression. During 2022, this line continued to study the role of chronic health conditions in patient response to interventions for depression as well as the adaptations and innovations necessary to optimize intervention results with this group of patients.

c) **Organization of research teams:** MIDAP is led by the Council of Associate Researchers, which holds monthly meetings. The tasks of the Council include: organizing and coordinating all the scientific-academic activities of the Institute; actively participating in the research conferences held each semester; making decisions about the promotion of researchers belonging to the Institute; defining the rules of allocation of some internal grants and selecting their beneficiaries; and making strategic decisions about the research conducted at the Institute, among other tasks. During this year, MIDAP's management positions and associate researchers remained unchanged, as the Institute chose to maintain a well-established group to successfully face the challenges of 2022 and achieve the goals set for this period.

All studies are conducted within at least one of the four lines of research described above. In many cases, the Study Director is an Associate Researcher. Increasingly though, as noted in the 2022 report, the study leader is an Adjunct, Young, or post-doctoral Researcher. This a direct result of the Institute's efforts to foster the scientific development of early career researchers. The Director of Research plays a relevant role in the coordination of research tasks within MIDAP, working alongside Study Directors and the Council of Associate Researchers in order to ensure the fulfillment of the scientific objectives of the Institute.

3. **Scientific and technological research:**

- a) **Current status of the lines of research:** The scientific objectives of MIDAP are: (a) To produce scientific knowledge about depression and personality based on a multidimensional perspective that integrates cultural, social, developmental, psychological, psycho-physical, and genetic aspects; (b) To examine specific age-related characteristics associated with depression and personality during pregnancy/nursing, infancy, adolescence, adulthood, and older adulthood; and (c) To generate knowledge that can nourish mental health policies for the development of improved prevention, therapy, and rehabilitation services.

In order to achieve these scientific goals, MIDAP develops four lines of research (see Annex 2). MIDAP's studies are executed within these lines of research based on different funding sources, including the Millennium Scientific Initiative (MSI) as well as other sources including Fondecyt, ANID, and international grants. Accordingly, MIDAP researchers are encouraged to apply for national and international grants, in order to sustain and/or continue their research.

The current chapter presents a summary of MIDAP's scientific activity during 2022. Organizing the information by line of research, we first present the scientific aim for each line summarily; then, we describe the main studies developed within each line of research during 2022 (Appendix 1), pointing out their progress during the reported period (for instance, indicating related productivity (articles numbered according to the listing in Appendix II) as well as other hallmarks of scientific output). Results are discussed in an integrative fashion, with attention to MIDAP's scientific goals. We conclude with the limitations and/or difficulties encountered.

Line of Research 1 (L1): Basic structures and bio-psycho-social processes. This line of research focuses on the origins and mechanisms that trigger, develop, and maintain psychological disorders, with a focus on depression and personality dysfunction. It is essential to keep in mind that MIDAP understands depression as a multi-causal, multi-level phenomenon. Thus, scientific efforts within L1 intend to evaluate all the cultural, social, developmental, and psychobiological conditions involved in depression and personality dysfunction. Line 1 continues to produce strong research at MIDAP, since we understand that different levels of intervention, including prevention and promotion well as remediation need to be grounded in sound basic research addressing the following questions: **Considering each specific level, how are genetic determinants, bio-markers, and psychological and interpersonal variables associated –and interact- with depressive symptomatology, clinical depression, personality dysfunction, suicidality and people's subjective well-being?**

L1 continue to strengthen and involves several ongoing and new research projects that have produced relevant scientific outputs. Studies developed within this line cover a broad range of scientific problems related to biological, psychological, and social processes and structures that continue to yield relevant results to advance the field and to strengthen promotion, prevention, and intervention initiatives and studies. Research focused on adapting measurement instruments for basic psychopathology dimensions are also included within this line of research. During 2022 the scientific activity in L1 continued to uncover disease mechanisms, conducting basic psychological research, understanding risk factors, and adapting instrumentation for local use. Within L1, mental health and COVI-19 studies continued during 2022, with new publications and new studies added to the line. These studies will be covered under the productivity of L1.

Study 001-L1 (The Psychopathology of Everyday-Life of Borderline Personality Disorder: Towards and Integrative Model of Disease Mechanisms). This study aims at producing relevant disease mechanism models for patients diagnosed with Borderline Personality Disorder (BPD) using Ecological Momentary Assessment (EMA). In the previous report, the healthy control sample was recruited, and during 2022, 60 patients were recruited and completed 11 days of EMA prompts focusing on identity and cognitive dysregulation, interpersonal dysregulation, behavior dysregulation and affective dysregulation, all core symptom areas of BPD. This study strengthens MIDAP's research of personality pathology using state of

the art experience sampling methodologies which allow to capture moment to moment influences between psychopathology dimensions. Also, during 2022 this research team at MIDAP submitted a paper for publication at *Journal of Medical Internet Research* featuring a systematic review and meta-analysis of EMA set-ups and their relationship to compliance, filling an important scientific gap in EMA research for patients diagnosed with BPD.

Study 011_L1 (Evaluation and Prediction of Suicide Risk) continued to focus on capacity building, during 2022, but also published a review article in *Frontiers in Psychiatry* (Paper #69), examining mental pain and its relationship to suicidal behavior. Authors used a text analysis tool, collecting terms most frequently linked with mental pain and suicidal behavior in the literature, this paper proposes clinical interventions for clinical conditions most commonly associated with mental pain. An additional paper was published examining the subjective experiences of family members that have experience a suicide attempt by an adolescent family member (Paper # 111).

Study 006-L1 (Evaluation of differential mechanisms for the influence of information technologies in the development and maintenance of anxious and depressive symptoms). This study, currently developed with a ANID Fondecyt Grant (11201010) examines an important area of research that has recently attracted prominent attention, namely the interaction between internet use and affordances and adverse mental health outcomes. More specifically, the study focuses on examining mechanisms that go from individual use of information technologies (e.g. online surfing, or gaming) to adverse mental health outcomes. Data analyses continued during 2022 focusing on the four distinct data-bases were completed with a total of 3000 participants sampled overall including adolescents and adults. Several articles were published during 2022 using this dataset. First an article published in *Computers and Human Behavior* (Paper #86) examined how coping mechanisms impact depressive symptoms in adolescents who face cyberbullying. The results suggest that active coping strategies such as seeking social support, assertiveness, and problem-solving were associated with lower levels of depressive symptoms, whereas avoidant coping mechanisms such as ignoring or denying the problem were associated with higher levels of depressive symptoms. The study highlights the importance of promoting active coping strategies in adolescents facing cyberbullying to reduce depressive symptoms. An additional paper published in the *International Journal of Environmental Research and Public Health* (Paper #87) explores the experiences of Chilean youth and adults who have been victims of cyberbullying during the COVID-19 pandemic. The study found that victims of cyberbullying reported higher levels of loneliness and depression compared to non-victims. Additionally, the study found that younger victims experienced higher levels of loneliness than adult victims. The study highlights the negative impact of cyberbullying on mental health, especially during times of increased social isolation and remote communication. It emphasizes the importance of raising awareness about cyberbullying and providing support to victims to mitigate its harmful effects on mental health. Also focusing on COVID and using a different sample an article also published in *Computers and Human Behavior* (Paper #16) examined the relationship between problematic internet use and depressive symptoms over time. The study found that problematic internet use was positively associated with depressive symptoms, and this relationship strengthened over time. The study also found that the influence of problematic internet use on depressive symptoms was partially mediated by perceived stress. The study emphasizes the need to address problematic internet use to prevent its negative impact on mental health, specifically depressive symptoms, over time. It highlights the importance of developing interventions that target problematic internet use and its associated stressors to promote better mental health outcomes.

Study 016-L1 (Effects of perceived discrimination and unfair treatment on health, obesity and metabolic syndrome: psychological and physiological mechanisms in a longitudinal study). Focusing on biological mechanisms this study is looking at the effects of perceived discrimination, an environmental stressor, on obesity. The study, under a ANID Fondecyt Grant (1180463), continued during 2022 and yielded new insights. Obesity is a major public health problem in the world and also in Chile, with 75% of the

population being overweight. One article published in 2022 (Paper # 83) explored the relationship between social support and obesity which was fully mediated by depressive symptomatology and emotional eating. An additional article published during 2022 (Paper #102) focused on additional social determinants of obesity, namely perception of social status. By itself social standing does not influence obesity, but when a path is models through the additional influence of discrimination, negative affect and diet quality, an influence can be identified.

Study 052-L1 (Promoting sensitive care: Modulating the oxytocin paradox through secure attachment priming), follows on the steps of previous study 051-L1 with a newly received grant from FONDECYT Grant (1221538). This project aims to determine how secure attachment modulation is related to the influence of oxytocin on parental behaviors and cognitions, depending on the level of early stress exposure. Thus, the project seeks to unravel the paradoxical effect of oxytocin administration in mothers who have experienced adverse experiences and expects that inducing mental states associated with secure attachment will promote more sensitive behaviors to baby signals. While the proposal has an experimental and basic approach, its potential for application is very high, especially in relation to possible intervention strategies that can be developed. Within this subject, the team published a chapter in a book edited by MIDAP and published by Springer. The chapter, entitled “Psychophysiology and Psychoneuroendocrinology of Stress and Reward in Depression” (Paper #140) provides a current view of this research field that builds on previous research by the team. An additional study already looking at attachment, but using a sample measured during the pandemic was published in the *International Journal of Public Health* (Paper #97) showed that attachment security is an essential factor to be considered in the relationships between relationships and mental health. The study provides strong recommendations for the use of specific individual attachment strategies to protect the mental health of the population during a crisis such as the pandemic.

Study 02-L1 (Facilitating and hindering factors of the search for psychological help in university students: An integrative and culturally relevant approach) has finished formal financing under ANID Fondecyt Grant (11180115) but continues to produce significant research. One article published in 2022 (Paper #82), investigated psychological service use utilization using an integrative conceptual framework. In this study, cultural beliefs about psychological care predicted intention to utilize psychological services, directly and indirectly, through outcome expectations and emotion. Specifically, positive cultural beliefs about receiving psychological care influenced outcome expectations and positive emotions which in turn predicted intention to utilize psychological services. Integrative approaches including socio-structural, cultural, and psychological determinants may result in more effective and culturally appropriate interventions aimed at reducing disparities in psychological services utilization. This research could contribute to the internationalization of knowledge on mental health services. This research team also continued to work on cultural adaptations of relevant instruments to be used in this field of research in Chile. Specifically, and crucial to the study of help-seeking behaviors among students, the team adapted the Self-concealment scale developed by Larson & Chastain. The study (Paper #85) showed that the measure presented adequate psychometric properties. During 2022, the team also published an article focusing on a comparison between Mexican and Chilean samples on indices of healthcare behaviors. The study showed that the perception of mistreatment and negative emotions were less intense in Chileans than Mexicans. However, the association between negative emotions and avoidance behaviors was stronger in Chileans (Paper #45).

Study 073-L1 (Using technology to facilitate international research on diagnosis and treatment of borderline personality disorder in adolescence, including low and middle-income countries – strategy based on direct clinical benefit). This study continues to develop as an international scientific collaboration including Chile, Switzerland, Kosovo, and Tanzania (<https://mhira-project.org/>). During 2022 a final version of the software Mental Health Information Reporting Assistant (MHIRA) was finished and it was implemented at the different project sites. The paper submitted in 2022 to *BMC*

Psychiatry was published with a review of short (50 items or less), free and digitally available instruments to measure psychopathology in children and adolescents (Paper #5). Also, in 2022 the project hosted a meeting in Lisbon, Portugal where final features of the MHIRA software were agreed on and planned for final development sprints. An additional article was prepared and submitted to the *Journal of Medical Internet Research*. A paper detailing the development and features of the software was submitted to *BMC Psychiatry* and is currently under review. This project has produced local adaptations of instruments for personality assessment. A study published in *Psychological Assessment* produces a multinational evaluation of measurement invariance of the Level of Personality Functioning Scale (LPFS-BF 2.0) (Paper #25). An additional study was published locally with a review of current diagnostic practices for Borderline Personality Disorder (Paper #103). This project's formally financing terminated in December 2022.

Line 1 COVID-19 and mental health studies. In the aftermath of the COVID-19 pandemic, MIDAP continues to actively develop research to further understand the impact of the pandemic on mental health. Several articles were published covering this topic from different angles.

Paper #55, published in *Frontiers in Psychiatry* presented results of a nationwide survey of psychological distress during the COVID-19 pandemic. The study identified a significant increase in psychological distress (PHQ-9), especially among female younger participants. Another study focused more closely on depressive symptomatology in female university students of a lower socio-economic status during the pandemic. In this group, lower perceived support by teachers was involved in emotion regulation strategies and with depressive symptomatology (Paper #64). A different study also focusing on university students discovered a high proportion of subthreshold and full-blown depressive episodes (Paper #65). Regulation strategies was also the focus of an additional paper looking at burnout and parental emotion regulation. Results indicate that during the pandemic, parental burnout was higher in mothers, who reported higher negative impact during this period. This impact was related to higher uses of emotional suppression and lower uses of reevaluation (Paper # 35). Similarly, another study found that parental burnout is predicted mainly by child age which is also related to levels of parent cooperation (Paper #15). Another team at MIDAP also focused on parenting, conducting a longitudinal study with measurement waves before the pandemic, at the initial outbreak and one month after strict lockdown. Several predictors to home chaos and parental mental health were identified, contributing to more nuanced and applicable models of mental health losses during the pandemic (Paper #31). Parental burnout was also assessed from global perspective, with results indicating that stricter norms regarding parenting roles and duties tend to increase levels of parental burnout (Paper #94). Social support decreased depressive symptoms during the pandemic in a different study, and this relationship appears to be moderated by attachment styles (Paper #97). Also focusing on negative impacts on mental health during the pandemic, researchers at MIDAP looked at trends in suicidal behavior during this period. Results of this study show that suicide and hospitalizations for attempted suicide decreased during the pandemic. Counties with more quarantined population showed more decreases in suicidal behavior (Paper #54). A different study found similar increases, this time looking alcohol consumption, which was, in turn predicted by depressive symptomatology, suggesting a maladaptive coping mechanism (Paper #79). MIDAP researchers were also involve in a global experiment looking at the effects strategies on motivating social distancing during the COVID-19 pandemic. Results show that more restricting and shaming messages were more effective than no messaging at all, but on less effective forms of motivation (i.e. based on guilt and shame). By contrast, autonomy-supportive messages appear to lower defiance and increase motivation for social distancing (Paper #67). Data suggesting negative trends in mental health during the pandemic highlight the problem of accessing treatment during restrictions.

Several additional articles relevant for the activity of L1 were published during 2022. These articles stem partially from research projects or are associated with other collaboration by MIDAP researchers and are reported thus as research activity within the line. A summary of such articles is provided in this section.

- The book *Etiopathogenic Theories and Models in Depression*, was published by Springer during 2022. This book was edited by MIDAP researchers and includes several chapters that were authored by our Institute's researchers. Papers #114, #117, #142, #124, #139, #140, #127, #141, #137, #114, #120, and #116 correspond to interesting chapters that are very good examples of Line 1 scholarship conducted by our researchers.
- Regarding instrumentation the psychometric qualities of the Perinatal Anxiety Scale were published (Paper # 4). The Generalized Anxiety Disorders Scale GAD-7 was adapted and studied in a community sample of adolescents in Chile (Paper #7). The General Help-Seeking Questionnaire was adapted and studied in a sample of university students (Paper #85). The ENRICHED Social Support Instrument (ESSI) was adapted and studied in a Chilean sample (Paper # 74).
- A study looking at childhood trauma and social cognition in persons with bipolar disorder was published in the *Journal of Affective Disorders* (Paper #101). A different study also looking at Bipolar Disorder was published in the *Journal of Experimental Psychopathology*, looking at social cognition (Paper #91). An additional article proposed clinical research diagnostic criteria for bipolar illness (Paper #60). These articles expand MIDAP's scope from depression to a broader look at emotional and affective disorders.
- Similarly, a study looking at psychotic experiences using a latent profile analysis framework was published in *Frontiers in Psychiatry* (Paper #66). Also focusing on psychosis, the incidence of non-affective psychotic disorders in Chile between 2005 and 2008 was examined (Paper #61). Finally, other researchers at MIDAP studied social perception deficits as a factor of vulnerability to psychosis (Paper #50).
- Three studies looking at psychiatric services in Chile were published. Using an interrupted time-series analysis, researchers at MIDAP examined the effects of national mental health plans on mental health services development in Chile between 1990 and 2017 (Paper #70). Also focusing on clinical services in Chile, a paper on the minimum and optimal number of psychiatric beds in Chile was produced using a Delphi consensus method (Paper #71) and an additional study looking at psychiatric beds in prison populations was published in *Psychological Medicine* (Paper #84).
- The issue of neuroprotection and neurotechnology was first tackled by researchers at MIDAP in several papers published in series of Books by Springer entitled *Ethics of Science and Technology Assessment* and in a Springer book edited by one researcher of MIDAP entitled *Protecting the Mind: Challenge sin Law, Neuroprotection, and Neurorights* (Papers #134, #136, #143, #135, and #133). This is a very important topic for the future of research and the use of neuro-data, which has become also a political issue in Chile, with new laws and constitutional entries currently debated.
- The issue of gender differences in risk for depression continues to be very central to MIDAP's work. Researchers at MIDAP led a paper looking at structural gender inequalities and symptoms of postpartum depression in 40 countries. Specifically, the study focused on abortion policies as a macro-level determinant of postpartum depression (Paper #100).
- Exposure to adverse childhood experiences continues to be a very important research focus for the institute, addressed by different studies and researchers. A review article about the use of psychological debriefing in acute traumatic events was published (Paper #43), as well as an article about the effects of trauma on the relationship between psychological wellbeing and depressive symptoms in Chilean university students (Paper #2).

- Over the past decades, Chile has received several immigration waves from countries in the region. Mental health and wellbeing as related to the process of immigration and acculturation certainly need to be tackled within the broader framework of social determinants of mental health. Several studies and articles published during 2022 address this topic. One article published in the *Journal of Environmental Research and Public Health* examined the role of acculturative stress and perceived social support in mental health as related to discrimination and negative emotions (Paper #44). Another article specifically looked at immigration experiences of migrants from Haiti, Colombia, and Venezuela in the south of Chile (Paper #108).
- Two studies looked at supports for persons diagnosed with HIV. One article published in *Plos One* performed a scoping review about internet-based peer support interventions for people living with HIV (Paper #51). A second article by the group of MIDAP researchers performed a systematic review to identify the characteristics of psychosocial interventions to improve ART adherence in people living with HIV (Paper #52).

Longitudinal studies. MIDAP continues to invest in research modules concerning depression in major longitudinal studies being currently conducted in Chile. As reported previously, methodologically, the best scientific strategies to study basic components of the etiology, development, maintenance, and exacerbation of depressive symptomatology in a given context is to use of longitudinal research designs. As previously reported, MIDAP has partnered with Research Centers that are carrying out large-scale longitudinal studies. Results from the first two waves (2010 and 2012) from the Encuesta Longitudinal de Primera Infancia (ELPI) [National Longitudinal Survey of Early Childhood] were presented in a previous report (2017).

Results from the Center for the Study of Social Conflict and Cohesion (COES) through its Longitudinal Social Study of Chile (ELSOC) continue to be available for researcher at MIDAP. ELSOC collects data from over 3000 individuals aged between 18 and 75 years. This particular study uses a probabilistic sampling method and achieves a representativity level of 77% of the national population and 93% of urban-area population. ELSOC collects data through seven thematic modules, one of which –health and well-being– screens for mental health difficulties, including depression. During 2022, the 2021 wave of data was published, corresponding to the fifth wave of this longitudinal study. Results indicate a relatively high prevalence of depressive symptomatology in Chile and confirm dramatic gender differences where depression disproportionately affects women (27% against 9.6 men affected with moderate to severe symptoms).

The Center for Intercultural and Indigenous Studies (CIIR) through ELRI were also reported in the previous year, with a particular emphasis on the mediational role of social support between discrimination and depressive symptoms for indigenous individuals. ELRI collects data from 3617 individuals aged 18 to 60 years. Individuals belong to different indigenous and non-indigenous groups from the north, central, and southern parts of Chile. Third-wave data was published and are now available for analysis at MIDAP. One chapter in a Springer Book edited by MIDAP researcher specifically used data from ELRI to look at depressive symptomatology in indigenous and non-indigenous individuals in Chile (Paper #141).

In summary, L1 studies continue to provide evidence in support of MIDAP’s multidimensional model that understands depression nested within personality and receiving influences from cultural, biological, psychological and genetic variables. Scientific activity within L1 during 2022 focused on biological mechanisms, social determinants of mental health and instrument validation studies. COVID-19 and mental health research continues to be important and the scope of mental health issues explored by MIDAP research expands to encompassed additional disorders. Methodological strategies within Line 1 continue to be quite diverse, which can be considered a strength, using both quantitative as well as qualitative approaches.

Line of Research 2 (L2): Health promotion and psychosocial prevention. This line of research focuses on assessing the effectiveness of intervention strategies aimed at changing the early conditions associated with the development of depression and personality dysfunction, reducing the social exclusion of people with psychological disabilities, and fostering the treatment capabilities of mental health professionals. Two sets of studies have been focusing on the scientific goals of L2. On the one hand, several studies continue to examine the implementation and effectiveness of depression prevention programs for children, adolescents, adults and families. Their current status and previously unreported scientific achievements are reported summarily.

Study 049-L2 (Trajectories and predictors of depressive and anxious symptomatology in family caregivers of people with dementia). This study is currently being developed under an ANID Fondecyt Grant (1191726). Formal funding will continue until 2023 and the team is currently working on analyzing collected data. During 2022 the team published a paper looking at predictors, types of internet use and psychological well-being of older adults (Paper #92). The findings of this study support the importance of differentiating the types of internet use to improve our understanding of its impact on psychological well-being. Another article outlined the protocol of a sub-study to examine the impact of a Yoga-Based Mindfulness Intervention for older adults with mild cognitive impairment (Paper #10). A study published in *PLOS ONE* examined the relationship between income inequality and loneliness prevalence using cross-sectional data from older adults in the US and Europe (Paper #39).

Study 021-L2 (Efficacy of a mobile application for early intervention of depression and anxiety in university students). This study was awarded a new Research Grant from ANID (Fondecyt Regular 1221230). The team is developing an app for early intervention of depression and anxiety in university students. The app has a viable MVP and piloting will start in 2023.

Study 007-L2 (Randomized pilot feasibility study of a group intervention by videoconference to promote maternal sensitivity in mother/infant dyads attended in Primary Health Care). This study is currently funded by a seed grant from UC. During 2022, data was collected and articles were written. Specifically, the study protocol was published during 2022 (Paper #29). An additional paper was published featuring an integral model of parental sensitivity in the mother-father-infant triad (Paper #28).

Study 010-L2 (Implementation and Evaluation of an Intervention with Video-feedback focused on Attachment Quality and Parental Reflective Function, aimed at Mother-Father-Child Triads with difficulties in Child Socioemotional Development). This is an older study that finished its formal funding period in 2017, but remains quite active with data being still analyzed. A new sub-study was designed and the research protocol was published during 2022 (Paper #3).

Study 090-L2 (Brief internet mentalization-based video feedback intervention to improve parental sensitivity in depressed mothers being treated in public health services: randomized controlled feasibility trial). This is a new study that is currently being conducted under a MIDAP FIP Grant. During 2022 the team published a book chapter in a book published by Springer and edited by MIDAP researchers. The chapter discusses the potential of internet-based interventions for prevention and treatment of perinatal depression (Paper #115). An additional article about early socio-emotional development and emotional dysregulation was also published (Paper #107). Finally, a model of generic change indicators in video-feedback interventions was published, featuring a single-case study of a depressed mother and her baby (Paper #37).

Study 013-L2 (Construction of co-parenting in pairs of first-time parents). This study is currently being developed under an ANID Fondecyt Grant (11180820). This research team published a book in 2022 on the topic of co-parenting around the arrival of an offspring (Paper #138). Also, a paper was published on the *Journal of Family Studies* focusing on the impact of social-health crisis on the development of co-parenting in first-time parental couples (Paper #78). Finally, an article was published locally about

disorders of regulation during first childhood. The article outlines recommendations for prevention and clinical management (Paper #96).

Study 089-L2 (Concordance in the physiological and subjective stress response. The role of temperament and family context in emotional regulation in late adolescents and young adults). This study was awarded in 2020 under an ANID Fondecyt Grant (1201576) and also brings together environmental and relational components to build causal models that explain the emergence of psychopathology. Interestingly, this study builds on previous research by MIDAP, specifically about a discrepancy between subjective and physiological responses to social stress. During 2022 a paper was published with the protocol of a study to test the effects of an online intervention to prevent postnatal depression and anxiety (Paper #30).

Study 012-L2 (Prevention of depression in adolescents in schools using mindfulness-based interventions), continued to explore the preventive effects of mindfulness-based interventions and the convenience of their deployment in school settings. During 2022, an article was published examining the impact of baseline mindfulness scores on the outcomes of a mindfulness-based intervention (Paper #88). This line of study is quite important within MIDAP because it helps to personalize treatments based on baseline data.

Study 018-L2 (Intervention in Attachment and Mentalization in caregivers of pre-school children) continued to develop over 2022. One article was published presenting the effects of a Vide-Feedback Intervention to foster sensitivity in teachers on Chile. After the intervention a significant increase in dyad and groups sensitivity was obtained (Paper #34). A broader paper on mentalization and parental stress was also published by this team (Paper #33). Finally, a study examining mentalizing capacities of caregivers and educators as related to the development of theory of mind in preschool children was published (Paper #93).

Several additional articles were published by line 2 researchers during 2022 that are either partially related to reported studies or emergent products stemming from additional collaborative projects. A summary of these articles and projects is presented in this section.

- By the end of 2022 a book edited by MIDAP researchers was published (first in line) by Springer. The book, entitled *Prevention and Early Treatment of Depression Through the Life Course* includes several chapters with contributions from MIDAP researchers. This book is part of a series of books about Depression and Personality that MIDAP has been developing with Springer.
- Internet-based interventions continue to be a strong part of MIDAP's work on prevention. Several researchers at MIDAP contributed to a book entitled *Manual of Tele-mental health: digital technologies in clinical practice*. Within this context, first a chapter featuring an historical perspective about technological interventions in mental health was published (Paper #130). Another chapter in internet-supported mental health interventions followed (Paper #122), then a chapter on mobile apps and mental health (Paper #121), then a chapter on the topic of implementation of technology supported mental health interventions (Paper #129). All these chapters consolidate a long line of e-mental health studies spearheaded by MIDAP in the region.
- Exposure to early-life maltreatment is a transversal topic of research for MIDAP. An article with a systematic review of protective factors for the interruption of intergenerational childhood maltreatment was published (Paper #40).

In summary, studies in L2 continue to provide good coverage regarding health promotion and prevention across the life span with increased scientific activities focusing on older persons, as a result of the first results of an ANID Fondecyt Grant (1191726). An emphasis on internet-based interventions continues to be present which presents with significant benefits in terms of coverage and dissemination. Indeed, the

importance of internet-based intervention for prevention of depression in adolescence has been further researched with a new research grant to develop an application for early intervention in university students with subthreshold depression and anxiety. A focus on parental sensitivity, mentalization and co-parenting has been further developed during 2022 as extremely important components of socioemotional health promotion and prevention of adverse mental health outcomes. The merits of video-feedback and mentalization-informed interventions continue to show merits and to appear to be feasible and effective strategies to strengthen socioemotional development in preschool children and toddlers. The work with caregivers, including teachers of pre-school children also appears to be a promising area to protect the mental health of children.

Line of Research 3 (L3): Psychotherapeutic interventions and change processes. This line of research focuses on the analysis of change processes and on the effectiveness of psychological interventions. Projects developed within L2 aim to answer the following research questions: **What are the characteristics of patients, therapists, and therapeutic models associated with the therapeutic change process and its outcomes? What change mechanisms are involved in the generation of therapeutic outcomes? What type of interactions occur between the profiles of patient and/or therapists, process variables, and psychotherapeutic outcomes?** Their current status of L3 studies and previously unreported scientific achievements are reported summarily.

Study 046-L3 (Characterization of the episodes of rupture and resolution of the alliance from the affective-facial communication of patients and therapists and their association with psychotherapeutic change: Distinctions for an effective clinical practice). This study is being developed under a ANID Fondecyt Grant (11180671). Formal funding was extended until October 2022 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. During 2022 the team worked on coding so that final analyses of the data may be performed. Additionally, the team focused an article with a wider scope about practice-based evidence in diverse mental health settings (Paper #1).

Study 015-L3 (Psychotherapy During Lockdown: How Psychotherapists Meet and How They Perceive Current Practice). During 2022, a qualitative study conducted in Latin America looked at the experiences of psychotherapists in clinical practice during the pandemic (Paper #12).

Study 003-L3 (Effectiveness of a brief Dialectical Behavior Therapy Skills training group for Borderline Personality Disorder in a public outpatient service in Chile: a multiple baseline comparison). This study was awarded a grant from MIDAP (FIP). Recruitment for the study was completed in 2022. The study involves a multiple-baseline design and additionally a baseline and post-treatment measurement using Ecological Momentary Assessment. Currently, the team is analyzing data and will present results in the upcoming SPR meeting in Dublin in 2023, which will be reported in more detail in the next period.

Study 048-L3 (Towards a comprehensive model of the therapeutic alliance in psychotherapy with depressed patients: understanding the relationship between the alliance, patient/therapist characteristics, process variables, and outcome). This study is still recruiting participants. Recruitment continues to be quite challenging due to the pandemic. Currently five centers are participating in the study and to date 350 participants have been recruited. Formal financing will continue until 2023. The project expanded the focus of research with a qualitative study on a subsample of participants who have been exposed to early life maltreatment.

Study 088-L3 (Psychotherapeutic change process in boys and girls who have been victims of sexual assaults: Towards a comprehensive model of the influence of factors of responsible adults, interventions and the therapeutic relationship; FONDECYT REGULAR 1200627). During 2022 an article was published featuring a qualitative analysis looking at the subjective experiences of their psychotherapy processes in children (aged between 7 and 14) who have been victims of sexual assaults (Paper #110). In-depth interviews were conducted at the end of psychotherapy processes and data was analyzed using a

narrative framework. Overall, children value their psychotherapy processes and interpret them as a source of valuable support. Furthermore, aspects that were indicated as being helpful were the therapeutic alliance, play and talking about the abuse in therapy. Based on the exploration of these experiences, an additional paper was published featuring a comprehensive model of psychotherapeutic change in the treatment of children who have been victims of sexual assault (Paper #46). Another study published during 2022 focused on the adverse childhood experiences of caregivers of children who have been victims of sexual assault. The relationship to parental alliance in child psychotherapy was explored (Paper # 127). Finally, the team authored a paper with other MIDAP researchers about the process of psychotherapeutic change and about the therapeutic relationship in child psychotherapy. This longitudinal qualitative study integrated the views from children, parents and therapists (Paper #27).

Studies 033-L3 (Distinctions in the Diagnosis and Prognosis of Depression in Psychotherapy: Relational Patterns, Internal Conflicts, and Vulnerabilities of Psychic Functioning and their Relationship to Psychotherapy Process Variables) and 035-L3 (Profiles of depression and their relationship to therapeutic change) continue to examine heterogeneity in depression and personality dysfunction and their bearing on therapy process and outcome with a grant from FONDECYT (Iniciación 11170561). During 2022 an article was published in *Frontiers in Psychology* looking at the process of tracking psychodynamic foci. Different types of psychodynamic foci were explored in their relationship to therapeutic change: relational patterns, conflict and personality functioning (Paper #8).

Study 008-L3 (Training in psychotherapeutic skills for the management of depression in Primary Health Care). This study developed under an ANID Fonis grant with formal financing terminating in December 2021. During 2022, a paper was published featuring a Delphi-validation of a training protocol of psychotherapeutic competences for the treatment of depression in primary health-care settings. This paper was crucial for the validation of the model produced by this project. The team has been using this protocol to training clinicians in the public care system in Chile.

Study 050-L3 (Development of a Comprehensive Model of Psychotherapy with LGBT Patients: A Qualitative Study of the Experiences of Patients and Psychotherapists). This study is currently developed under an ANID Fondecyt Grant (1190270). During 2022 the team published a paper about internalized stigma and its relationship to mental health and help-seeking behaviors (Paper #20), and worked on a chapter about culturally competent psychotherapy and psychiatric care for a book edited by MIDAP researchers on mental health work in primary health care settings. Additionally, the team published a paper showcasing the development of a collaborative Latin-American network for research in psychotherapy and mental health in sexual and gender diversity (Paper #90).

Several additional articles were published by line 3 researchers during 2022 that are either partially related to reported studies or emergent products stemming from additional collaborative projects. A summary of these articles and projects is presented in this section.

- One qualitative study was published featuring an analysis of “failures in psychotherapy” was published in *Counseling Psychology Quarterly* (Paper #38).
- Three process-research articles about psychotherapy in people diagnosed with Borderline Personality Disorder (BPD) were published. One process-research study looked at self-organization in dialogical patterns using a single case-analysis model. This article was published in *Counseling and Psychotherapy Research* (Paper #22). A second article also using a single-case method examined the dynamic patterns of personal positions of a patient and her therapist during change moments in therapy (Paper #24). A third study explored dynamic patterns in the voices of a patient diagnosed with BPD and her therapist in a long-term psychotherapeutic treatment (Paper #23).

- A study featuring the results of a multisite RCT comparing Adolescent Identity Treatment (AIT) against Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT) for the treatment of adolescent borderline personality disorder was published in *Personality Disorders: Theory, research, and practice*. This article stems from an ongoing international network reported in more detail in chapter 4. AIT showed to be non-inferior to DBT for adolescents (Paper #36).
- A systematic review about results of psychotherapy in adults from a dynamic systems perspective was published locally (Paper #21).
- A paper presenting the results of a study looking at potential epigenetic mechanisms in psychotherapy was published in *Frontiers in Human Neuroscience* (Paper #32). The study looked specifically at DNA methylation and mentalization change in psychotherapy for patients with BPD.
- An article was published in *Psychotherapy Research* examining the subjective experience of recovery from depression. (Paper #11).

In summary, L3 continues to concentrate a significant proportion of MIDAP's scientific efforts and scientific output. From effectiveness outcome research to studies focusing on micro processes of discourse-voice regulation, L3 provides a broad set of projects which have supplied findings that contribute significantly to understand mechanisms involved in psychotherapeutic change. An enhanced focus on personality dysfunction can be identified in scientific output during 2022 as well as interesting findings regarding potential epigenetic modifications in the course of psychotherapy.

Line of Research 4 (L4): Mitigation of Chronicity in the Course of Depression. This line of research focuses on the patient's recovery and on reducing the chronicity and recurrence of depression. Research projects developed within L4 address the following questions: **(a) What are the post-treatment variables that are associated to decreased rates of relapse and chronicity? (b) what characterizes patients with recurrent and complex depression (depression comorbid with personality dysfunction), and how should they be managed in order to reduce recurrence of depressive disorders and its burden on the subjective and societal level?** The current status and previously unreported scientific achievements of L4 studies are reported summarily.

Study 043-L4 (A collaborative computer-assisted cognitive-behavioral educational and psychological treatment for depressed patients with chronic disease at primary care). This study is currently financed by an ANID Fondecyt Grant. The study continued to collect data during 2022, no publications are reported during this time period.

In summary, focus on chronicity and recovery continued to be developed within L4, and during 2022 most progress was seen in the area of the role of chronic health conditions on treatment response to anti-depressive interventions as well as treatment adaptations and innovations to optimize treatment results for this group of patients.

- b) **Productivity:** During the reported period, 145 scientific documents were published, more than any previous year. The steady increase in publications from MIDAP is quite remarkable and cannot be attributed by this point to the relative increase in time during the pandemic (i.e. less time for field work and more time for publishing). Rather, it indicates scientific density and a remarkable number of research projects for the Institute. As new projects were awarded recently, this trend is expected to increase even more. Publications include 114 articles, 4 books, and 27 book chapters. With respect to scientific articles, 104 (70.3%) were published in journals indexed in *Web of Science/SCOPUS*. Of these 104 articles, 23 (22.1%) were published in quartile 1 (Q1) and 24 (23.1%) in quartile 2 (Q2) journals. When looking at publications by line of research, most publications originated from L1 (56.6%) followed by L2 (25.5%), L3 (17.2%) and L4 (0.01%).

Out of a total of 145 publications authored or co-authored by MIDAP researchers, in 79 of them, only one researcher participated, in 31 of them two researchers from MIDAP participated, 14 articles were authored by three or more researchers, and 18 articles were co-authored by 4 or more researchers (see Annex 3.5). This means that a substantial part of the publications of the Institute continue to be collaborative, and we will continue to encourage associative scientific work and publishing between researchers. Students were part of 32 of these publications (13 were student-led) which also points to an important focus of further development, namely to encourage joint publications between AR and students. Also, out of 145 articles published during 2022, 76 involved Young Researchers or Postdoctoral Researchers as co-authors (15 were led by such researchers).

MIDAP maintains the position reported in 2017 regarding “open access” publications. Some of these journals are of high quality (for example *Frontiers in Psychology* or *PLOS One*), they have rigorous peer-review procedures, and high-quality output with high dissemination, because there are no costs associated with access to articles. The cost of publication continues to be a difficulty for our researchers, particularly because Chilean researchers typically do not qualify for standard discounts given the development level of the country.

- c) **Outstanding publications:** Because scientific output in high-impact journals is of high relevance for the dissemination of MIDAP’s scientific achievements, publications in the following journals are highlighted:

During 2022, the first of MIDAP two additional books from the series Depression and Personality were published by Springer. To the first book that was published in 2021 the books *Etiopathogenic Theories and Models in Depression* and *Prevention and Early Treatment of Depression Through the Life Course* were added. This books series which is expected to grow highlights the consolidation of MIDAP research in high-impact books that are published worldwide by a very well know publisher. In this regard, this series of books contributes to disseminate MIDAP’s research globally.

The article “Potential epigenetic mechanisms in psychotherapy: a pilot study on DNA methylation and mentalization change in borderline personality disorder” published in *Frontiers in Human Neuroscience* is an important empirical contribution to previous work that was published from a more conceptual point of view. Studying mechanisms of epigenetic modifications during psychotherapy is challenging and it was well achieved by a team of researchers.

Two articles published in the journal *Computers in Human Behavior* are worth highlighting in this section. The first article entitled “To ignore or not to ignore: The differential effect of coping mechanisms on depressive symptoms when facing adolescent cyberbullying” presents relevant research on an important subject that has been shown to have powerful effects on mental health, namely cyberbullying. A second article entitled “Watching the world from my screen: A longitudinal evaluation of the influence of a problematic use of the internet on depressive symptomatology” also examines the relationship between technology (internet) use and mental health using Ecological Momentary Assessment. Both articles tackle the issue of information technologies, internet use and mental health.

- d) **Congress Presentations:** During 2022, 138 presentations were delivered, which signals an 33% increase from last year. Of these presentations, 80 (58%) of them were delivered physically or virtually in international venues (details are presented in Appendix II). Thirty-three percent (33%) of all presentations included MIDAP students (in more than 90% of them students were the first author), which is an important metric regarding capacity building. Thirty-nine (39) presentations stem from L1 (21 national, 18 international), 24 from L2 (13 national, 17 international), 63 from L3 (22 national, 41 international), in addition to 6 shared presentations in L1 and L3, and another 5 presentations in L2 and L3. This high number of presentations in international events related to L3 is mainly explained by the high participation of MIDAP in the annual congresses of the Society for Psychotherapy Research (SPR).

And later, he obtained the Travel Award given by the Society for Psychotherapy Research, SPR, to attend and present his postdoctoral research work at the SPR 53rd International Annual Meeting 2022, held in Denver, USA.
 - **Ulises Ríos:** In the framework of the Annual Conference of the International Society of Bipolar Disorders (ISBD), held in June 2022, MIDAP Collaborator Researcher Ulises Ríos, from the Department of Psychiatry of the School of Medicine of the University of Valparaíso received the "Samuel Gershon Junior Investigator Award", a prestigious award given by this scientific society. The award is given to five internationally outstanding young researchers, based on original studies in the field of mood disorders. The work that motivated the award was the article "The interaction of the oxytocin receptor gene and child abuse subtypes on social cognition in euthymic patients with bipolar disorder type I: A gene environment model", in which also participated the Junior Researcher Javier Morán and the director of MIDAP, Juan Pablo Jiménez, who was also the guide of Ríos' doctoral thesis, research from which this work is derived.

4. **Education and Capacity Building**

- a) **Education, Training and Capacity Building:** MIDAP is a renowned research center that generates a high level of interest among young people who are receiving training in multiple areas of research linked to mood and personality disorders and other fields where the Institute operates. Like every year, a relevant number of undergraduate and graduate students enrolled in the various programs offered by the host universities –e.g. psychology, clinical psychology, psychotherapy, neuroscience– asked to join MIDAP during 2022 to produce their theses with MIDAP researchers working on their subjects of interest.

To channel this interest, there is a well-defined procedure –established when the Institute was founded and managed by the executive board– which allows students working on their theses or research assistants collaborating with our researchers to apply to join our group. Upon joining MIDAP, students begin receiving periodic information about the Institute's scientific and educational activities, apart from being encouraged to apply for a variety of funding opportunities offered by the Institute. For instance, they can get financial support to participate in scientific events* in Chile or abroad, commission translation and/or editing services for their scientific manuscripts*, fund part of their doctoral theses*, give presentations at internal meetings and seminars, and receive thesis supervision, among other uses¹. Due to our limited annual budget, a competitive grant process is used in some cases, for example, for MIDAP members to attend congresses and cover doctoral thesis costs, whereas other funding is freely available, such as editing/translation and publication funds. Furthermore, MIDAP members can apply for grants to complete internships at foreign universities, which are covered with funding provided by the following host universities: UC, UFRO, UDD, and UDP. The funds provided by the first three institutions are also awarded through a competitive grant process, while UDP directly manages its grants.

Also, as pointed out in previous reports, people who have completed a PhD under the aegis of MIDAP are able to continue their work at the Institute by joining it as Collaborator-Researchers. This category is used by MIDAP to designate individuals who support the Institute's scientific-technical activities but without any productivity obligations and without any direct MIDAP funding. MIDAP opens frequent promotional processes for Collaborators to enter another formal category such as Young or Adjunct Researcher –if they are interested in doing so and meet the necessary requirements. Furthermore, as MIDAP Collaborators, they are eligible for institutional sponsorship to apply for external grants, get support for paper publication, and participate in scientific events, among other opportunities.

However, potential economic support is not the only factor that motivates young students to join MIDAP. The main draw is the chance to gain support for disseminating and prompting debate on their thesis results through multiple means, including supervisions, student exchange opportunities, and collaboration with mental health professionals and leading Chilean and foreign researchers. They also gain access to instruments and get the chance to present their work at one of the four annual Plenary Meetings or other similar events, which extends the scope of the discussion and dissemination of their results.

Another specific contribution of MIDAP to the training of young researchers since 2020, in this case at a postdoctoral level, relies on funding received from the UCs Vice-president's Office for Research. These funds are used to grant a 2-year stipend to a postdoctoral researcher conducting their research within one of MIDAP's FIP projects (internal competition for the allocation of funds to carry out research in priority areas [Priority Research Funding (FIP)] - defined by the institute in 2019). Also, the funds provided annually by the Faculty of Social Sciences and the School of Psychology UC directly benefit MIDAP doctoral students enrolled at UC, enabling them to complete short research internships at prestigious research centers abroad.

- b) **Achievements and Results:** During 2022, MIDAP added 39 new young people, reaching the figure of 267 young trainees since its beginning. Specifically, MIDAP has hosted 43 undergraduate students, 97 master's

students, 91 doctoral students, and 14 Postdoctoral Researchers (PR). To date, 129 students have graduated with their studies or theses under the guidance of MIDAP researchers: 42 PhDs, 79 master's degrees and 8 undergraduate degrees. Furthermore, 22 Young Researchers (YR) have been part of MIDAP during these years. This large overall figure reflects young people's interest in joining MIDAP, since they regard it as a center of excellence relevant to their careers.

Forty-seven doctoral students, 37 master's students, and 14 undergraduate students were part of MIDAP during 2022. Detailed information in Annex 5. As usual, most doctoral students are enrolled in the Doctoral Program in Psychotherapy, jointly offered by UC and UCh. Other students are enrolled in Doctoral Programs in Psychology (UC, UCh, USACH, UDP, and UFRO), in UDEC's Doctoral Program in Mental Health, in UDD's Doctoral Program in Developmental Sciences and Psychopathology, in UC's Doctoral Program in Neurosciences, and in Doctoral Programs in Public Health (UC and UCh). Most of MIDAP's master's students came from UC's MSc in Clinical Psychology, while the rest came from UCh's MSc in Child and Adolescent Clinical Psychology and UC's MScs in Psychology and Health Psychology.

The activities and figures related to human capital training during 2022 have helped us to continue to comply with one of our global aims: to make a decisive contribution to the generation of advanced human capital in Chile and Latin America through graduate education and post-doctoral training and collaboration with universities in master's- and undergraduate-level education.

Twenty MIDAP students successfully completed their theses: eight doctoral students, 10 master's students, and two students who obtained their bachelor's degree in psychology. Details in Appendix 4.

Seven of these new PhDs –Augusto Mellado, Cecil Mata, Denise Gerber, Elyna Gómez-Barris, Karla Álvarez, and Marianne Cottin, who graduated from the Doctoral Program in Psychotherapy jointly offered by UC and U de Chile, plus Pablo Vergara, who completed the doctoral program in Mental Health at Universidad de Concepción– are involved in ongoing MIDAP studies and were invited to stay at the Institute as Collaborator Researchers.

The gradual normalcy attained after the critical stage of the COVID-19 pandemic allowed MIDAP students to start applying for internships at foreign research centers again. In this context, 3 doctoral students affiliated to MIDAP traveled in 2022 to other 3 centers to conduct part of their theses with the support of renowned foreign researchers: Mahaira Reinel (Adelphi University and Mount Sinai Beth Israel, United States of America), Nina Immel (Witten/Herdecke University, Germany), and Pamela Franco (Vrije Universiteit Amsterdam, The Netherlands). Furthermore, between April and June 2022, Laura Sicilia, a Brazilian doctoral Psychology student at Universidad de Barcelona, conducted an internship with Adjunct Researcher Claudia Capella in the Universidad de Chile on various aspects of her thesis work and other activities (more details in Annex 5.2).

Also, 11 doctoral students received a small monetary grant from MIDAP aimed at supporting their thesis work: Antonia Muzard, Catalina Núñez, Catalina Undurraga, Nicolás Labbé, Stephanie Vaccarezza, Víctor Gómez, Christian Spuler, Felipe Concha, Mahaira Reinel, Pamela Franco, and Rosario Guajardo.

Out of 138 studies presented at national and international conferences during 2022, 64 involved YRs and PRs as co-authors (with 33 being led by them), while 45 included student participation (with 31 of them being student-led). A total of 15 graduate students received financial support from MIDAP to cover congress registration fees, as all events were held remotely, through application processes established by MIDAP to provide such aid. Out of 145 articles published during 2022, 76 involved YRs or PRs as co-authors (15 were led by such researchers) and 32 included student participation (13 were student-led).

In July 2022, the 53rd International Annual Meeting of the Society for Psychotherapy Research (SPR) was held in Denver, USA. On this occasion, 21 MIDAP researchers, nine students attached to the Institute and two research assistants participated with their work. Postdoctoral researcher Yamil Quevedo, doctoral student Mahaira Reinel and master's student Jesús Vidal obtained the SPR Student Travel Award to attend

the event in person. On the other hand, the Psychology students of Universidad Diego Portales, Carla Vásquez, María Victoria Díaz and Francisca Avilés, obtained the 3rd place in the "Lester Luborsky Student Poster award", with the work entitled "It feels like you're not alone": peer support for bipolar patients, a review", result of an elective practice directed by Javiera Duarte, Young Researcher of MIDAP.

Eight diploma programs directed by MIDAP's researchers requested sponsorship from the Institute in 2022. All of these programs are a fundamental part of the activities conducted by MIDAP in collaboration with other universities. The average annual enrollments for these programs ranged from 20 to 25 professionals:

- Personality Disorders: Current Perspectives and Clinical Tools (UC)
- Interventions for Depression and Other Mood Disorders: Conceptualization and Intervention Strategies (UC)
- Mindfulness and Psychotherapy (UC)
- Mindfulness and Self-Care: Mind and Body in Balance (UC)
- Couples Psychotherapy from a Systemic-Relational Perspective (UC)
- Psychopathology of Bonding: Diagnosis and Treatment (UC)
- Mood Disorders for Psychologists (UdeCh)
- Psychotherapy and Mental Health in Gender, Sexual, and Relationship diversity (UDP)

On April 2022, we offered the third version of the training course entitled "Mindfulness: Science and Health". On this occasion, we adopted an online format. Mindfulness can be defined as the ability to pay attention to one's experience of the present moment with an attitude that includes kindness and non-judgment. Over the last decades, mindfulness practices have been incorporated into healthcare in order to develop new ways of approaching difficult experiences. Mindfulness practitioners cultivate greater awareness and acceptance of their experience. This new approach has resulted in the establishment of "contemplative studies", which have identified a number of biological correlates and mechanisms of action of contemplative practices. Recent studies have highlighted their potential in the prevention and management of depression, anxiety, and stress. In line with these recent findings, MIDAP offers this experiential and didactic course informed by the contributions of contemplative practices –mindfulness and compassion– to personal and relational well-being. The course was facilitated by Adjunct Researcher Sebastián Medeiros and was attended by 30 professionals working in the healthcare field and other related areas.

The course "**Suicide Risk: Assessment and Management**" was again offered during 2022 (online). The sessions, held in August, were led by Adjunct Researchers Susana Morales and Orietta Echávarri, together with Collaborator Researchers Tita Szmulewicz, Claudia Moya, María de la Paz Maino, and Cristóbal Morales. The attendees were 54 healthcare professionals and others working in related disciplines who are in contact with potentially at-risk adolescents or adults. As usual, its objective was to present effective tools for detecting, evaluating, and managing suicide risk to professionals working with people who may be susceptible to it.

The course "**Early childhood video-feedback intervention**" was offered again in 2022 (in January and August, both times online). The teaching team included Associate Researcher Marcia Olhaberry, Postdoctoral Researcher Catalina Sieverson, and Collaborator Researcher Fanny Leyton. Parenting-focused interventions have been found to be among the most effective in promoting well-being and preventing difficulties during childhood. In this context, video-feedback represents an exceptional intervention tool, with numerous studies showing its impact on interaction and bond quality as well as on mental health and child development variables. The video-feedback course also seeks to improve therapists' reflective skills, allowing them to identify their own mental states and their triggers in themselves and the dyads or triads receiving care. This course was designed to provide initial theoretical and practical content for participants to understand and use video feedback when working with young children and their families. The two versions of the course were attended by a total of 55 young professionals.

On November 21, 2022, we offered the course “**Introduction to the Theory and Technique of Mentalization-Based Treatment (MBT)**”, accredited by IMAGINA - Center for Mentalization Applications (Spain). This course, taught by Dr. Norka Malberg, from the Yale Child Study Center, Anna Freud National Centre for Children and Families, London, and the Vidal i Barraquer Foundation of Barcelona, and Dr. Mark Dangerfield, Director of the Vidal i Barraquer Mental Health Institute, Universidad Ramon Llull (Barcelona), sought to provide an introduction to the main theoretical concepts of mentalization theory as well as an introduction to the main technical aspects of the therapeutic intervention model of Mentalization-Based Treatment (MBT). The course allowed attendees to register for official MBT-C and MBT-A training programs, providing the necessary previous knowledge to make the most of them. Being an introductory course, it was aimed at mental health professionals (from the fields of clinical psychology, psychiatry, social work, and nursing) and undergraduate and graduate students from the same specialization fields with an interest in learning about the theoretical foundations and some technical principles of this therapeutic intervention model. A total of 83 participants attended the course. The course was delivered in-person at Universidad Diego Portales, one of MIDAP’s host institutions, and was based on the text “Mentalization-Based Treatment for Children. A Time Limited Approach”, one of whose authors was Dr. Norka Malberg, facilitator of the course.

Participants from other regions of Chile and from other countries were able to enroll in each course. This has increased MIDAP’s visibility and extended the range of young public or private sector professionals wishing to learn about new tools and acquire knowledge applicable to their fields of expertise. In 2022, our courses had participants from all regions of Chile, as well as professionals from Mexico and Ecuador.

At MIDAP, we consider that the role of the continuing education area is important, since the participation of professionals –most of whom belong to public healthcare entities– allows the Institute to have a large impact on their workplace tasks and activities; that is, largely based on the results of MIDAP studies, we can have a direct influence on how they conduct their work after attending our courses.

- c) **Destination of Students:** The situation of MIDAP students, as it relates to their destination upon completion of their studies, has not changed. Although some students who have obtained their doctoral degrees in recent years are affiliated with their universities on fixed-term contracts and without an academic position, others have gradually signed permanent contracts in a number of Chilean institutions. In addition, many of them are still involved in clinical work, putting into practice what they learned throughout the doctoral program as well as the results of their own research. As previously explained, most of them are now associated with MIDAP as Postdoctoral Researchers or Collaborator Researchers.

5. Networking and other collaborative work

a) Networking: During 2022, MIDAP continued to consolidate its international footprint, maintaining and strengthening many of its international networks, particularly given the lift of travel bans that affected previous reporting periods because of COVID-19. As it has been previously reported, MIDAP's international activity can be organized in six areas of scientific work: (a) Depression and Personality Dysfunction, (b) Biological and Personality Interactions and Cultural Aspects in the Development of Psychological Disorders, (c) Change Processes in Psychotherapy, (d) Longitudinal Studies on the Development of Depression, (e) Mindfulness and other Contemplative Practices, (f) E-Mental Health Research, and (g) Early Developmental Conditions. Collaborative activity within the above-mentioned areas will be reported under the current heading (Networking and Annex 6.1) as well as under the heading other Collaborative activities (Annex 6.2).

a.1) Depression and Personality Dysfunction. The scientific collaboration to establish an International Network for the Study of the Heterogeneity of Depression (CONICYT, PCI REDES180104), continues to develop with researchers from the University of Sheffield and from Columbia University. In fact, during 2022 the network was strengthened by researchers from Switzerland and Austria. Datasets from all the countries, including Uganda and Ethiopia (from our colleagues at Columbia University) have been compiled and the groups is working on a publication comparing depressive profiles at a global scale.

a.2) Biological and Personality Interactions and Cultural Aspects in the Development of Psychological Disorders. MIDAP's Young Researcher Dr. Natalia Salinas (Universidad de la Frontera) continues to develop an international network entitled Culture and Behavior Laboratory with colleagues from Loma Linda University, USA. This network also includes students, joined publications and conference and periodic coordination meetings as well as a formal agreement of collaboration. Currently some research and exchange activities of the network are financed by an ANID Fondecyt Grant (11180115). Another network, the Platform for Social Research on Mental Health in Latin America (PLASMA) involves researchers from Chile, Brazil, Uruguay, Argentina, Perú, Colombia, Ecuador and Panamá. MIDAP has sponsored this group from its beginning and currently it has become a stable platform for scientific collaboration. Periodic scientific output is published in the website (blogplasma.wordpress.com), and the network has produced joint publications. Finally, in the area of biological and personality interaction, joint scientific work has been conducted between researchers at MIDAP and Heidelberg University and Concordia University in Montreal.

a.3) Change Processes in Psychotherapy. The international network "Psychotherapy and Change – Latin-American Network of Psychotherapy Research" includes members from Chile, Argentina, Brazil, Colombia, México, Perú, Panamá, and Ecuador. MIDAP has supported this important local network in an effort to strengthen regional ties in the area of psychotherapy research. Additionally MIDAP sponsored an Ibero-American meeting of the Society for Psychotherapy Research which strengthened the scientific ties between researchers in Latin-America, but also in Spain. A formal collaboration agreement was signed by involved centers and researchers during the previous reporting period. The network "Active Ingredients of Change in Transference Focused Psychotherapy: Towards the identification of candidate interventions for short-term, modular interventions for patients with complex, treatment-resistant depression" remains active. This network involves researchers from MIDAP, from Cornell and from City University of New York.

a.4) Mindfulness and other Contemplative Practices. MIDAP continues its ongoing scientific and training networks within the area of Mindfulness. A new version of this international network consolidates joint work between Chile and Germany (Heidelberg University). This network remains active.

a.5) E-Mental Health Research. The network E-Mental Health for Depression: Latin-American experiences continues to strive, involving researchers and center from Chile, Colombia, México and

Germany. During 2022 new funding was secured through an ANID grant for international scientific collaboration entitled “International Network for the fostering and development of Digital Mental Health.” This new international collaboration funds consolidates and strengthens previous international work by MIDAP and associated centers. In the proposed international network, researchers from different institutions in Chile, Peru (Cayetano Heredia University), Colombia (CES University), Germany (Heidelberg University Hospital), the Netherlands (Vrije Universiteit Amsterdam), and the United Kingdom (King's College London) will synergistically cooperate, integrating knowledge and capabilities in various areas related to the development of SMD: (1) design and evaluation of prevention, detection, and treatment strategies based on SMD; (2) involvement of users, professionals, and associations; and (3) sustainability and dissemination of interventions.

An additional network between MIDAP and centers in Basel, Switzerland, Pristina, Kosovo, and Dar es-Salam, Tanzania has been developing a software to enhanced the capacity to detect mental health problems in los resource settings. The software MHIRA (Mental Health Information reporting Assistant) is finished now (<https://mhira-project.org/>) and the code is available to be downloaded for free (<https://github.com/mhira-project>).

a.6) Early Developmental Conditions. During 2018, an international research grant was awarded by CONICYT to create the Network for the Study of Emotion Regulation within the Family Context, involving researchers from Universidad del Desarrollo and MIDAP in Chile, University of California Davis in the USA, and the University of Melbourne in Australia. The aim of the network is to foster scientific exchange and develop multilateral training initiatives. During 2022, this network continued to resume activities that were halted due to the pandemic. The network continues to be active. In addition, a network has operated to study on early development contexts, aspects of personality, and mentalization in depression. This network includes researchers from MIDAP, the Research Group on Stress and Depression, Université Catholique de Louvain, Belgium, the University College London, England, and the “Parent Infant Consultation” and “Operationalized Psychodynamic Diagnosis (OPD) Task Force” at Heidelberg University Hospital.

f) Other collaborative activities.

As previously reported, regarding the development of **longitudinal studies**, MIDAP has partnered with national research centers, which has resulted in a significant strengthening of Research Line 1 (details are presented in Section 3). Specifically, MIDAP has contracted with the Center for Intercultural and Indigenous Studies (CIIR) to include a mental health module in the Longitudinal Survey on Intercultural Relationships (ELRI). MIDAP has also contracted with the Center for the Study of Social Conflict and Cohesion (COES) to include a mental health module for depression and subjective well-being in the Longitudinal Social Study of Chile (ELSOC). Finally, the Encuesta Longitudinal de Primera Infancia (ELPI) [National Longitudinal Survey of Early Childhood] is preparing its fourth wave of data collection for 2023. One doctoral student at MIDAP is currently analyzing these databases to explore depression heterogeneity.

During 2020 MIDAP started a collaboration with MIDE, a measurement center based at the School of Psychology UC. During 2022 this collaboration continued and joint projects were conducted mainly to asses mental health of students in one of Chile’s largest technical universities. This study evaluated the mental health of 9,000 students and to date constitutes the largest mental health study on technical students in Chile.

In addition, regarding **early developmental conditions**, MIDAP continues to have researchers participating formally in the Attachment & Adoption Research Network, which includes 12 countries in four continents. The network brings together an international group of researchers with the scientific aim of examining the development of attachment bonds in children deprived of their families. The network

provides common instrumentation to advance research in this topic and aggregates findings in collaborative publications. Our Associated Researcher Dr. Pia Santelices is a formal member of the Chile team within this network. Dr. Santelices continues to serve as Director of the Center CUIDA (Center for research in abuse and early adversity).

Under an ongoing research project, (FONDECYT Regular 1191299) a scientific collaboration with Psiocomédica Clinical Group, a Santiago-based mental health treatment center continues to flourish. Additional centers were added to this project including CONPER and COSAM Pudahuel.

MIDAP has also continued to collaborate with the International Society for the Study of Personality Disorders (ISSPD), where MIDAP's Director of Research, Dr. Alex Behn is Vice-President in charge of the Latin American Group. During 2022 work centered around the organization of the 2023 meeting in Sydney, Australia.

6. Outreach and connections with other sectors

- a) **Outreach:** With its outreach and dissemination activities, in 2022, MIDAP continued to strengthen its position as a serious and trustworthy source of information on mental health topics, with an emphasis on depression and personality functioning. Nine years of high-quality research in this field have produced a body of scientific evidence that lends MIDAP researchers the credence required to inform society as a whole. For this reason, MIDAP professionals were permanently asked to provide their authoritative voice as mental health experts, leading to over 90 registered media appearances this year. CNN Chile's SanaMente concentrated most of these appearances, featuring more than one MIDAP researcher on its second season, broadcast between May and December (for more details, see Annex 7.1).

Sharing the advances and findings derived from our work is among the key objectives of MIDAP's wide range of public communication activities. Such efforts increase the Center's public visibility while also furthering one of the stated goals of the Ministry of Science, Technology, Knowledge, and Innovation: transferring the knowledge generated and helping the target audience of each activity and/or those who receive the information to make this knowledge their own.

The high prevalence of mental health disorders, cultural prejudices, and a lack of information about how to prevent, treat, and rehabilitate patients with such disorders wholly justify the need to engage in science communication to disseminate evidence-based content, challenge longstanding myths, and promote knowledge and awareness about emotional well-being and its consequences on physical well-being from early childhood to old age. This educational work has become even more pressing after the lengthy COVID-19 pandemic, which deteriorated the mental health of many Chileans, complicating preexisting mental diseases and/or intensifying others. Under these circumstances, it became highly relevant to communicate the results of ongoing and completed studies in a timely manner and in a way that reached the largest audience possible, including the new findings generated by MIDAP researchers during the pandemic.

After the COVID-19 pandemic made it impossible to schedule in-person activities in 2020, and very difficult in 2021, in 2022 –with lower infection indexes given the high nationwide vaccination rates–, possibilities arose to participate in (and organize) events with in-person audiences. Thus, MIDAP set up a stand in the Science Walk section of the Puerto de Ideas Science Festival (Antofagasta), held in-person from April 18 to 24 after two years of virtual festivals. At the stand, staff delivered information about the Institute, distributed printed copies of the “Guide for helping children to cope with climate change”, a document produced by the Cuida Center with the support of MIDAP, gave away small coloring books with mandalas and phrases related to emotional well-being, and provided visitors with post-its and pencils for them to write down or draw how they were feeling that day and to describe what emotions they were experiencing, as a way of promoting mental health. Furthermore, the stand showed the psychoeducational animated videos produced recently by the Institute and cartoonist Guillo. This audiovisual material offers guidelines on how to deal with various specific problems and events, including the “social explosion” and the pandemic. In the Science Walk, a meeting among various scientific institutions, students, and family audiences held from April 21 to 24, MIDAP was represented by Associate Researcher María Pía Santelices, who gave two presentations: first, “How to talk about depression with children? The contribution of short stories”, after which she talked with a group of 5th grade students about depression, emotional connectedness, and strengthening affective bonds in this stage of life, while also addressing the contribution of short stories as a resource for discussing this issue with small children, their families, and their teachers. On this occasion, she read out some fragments from the book *¿Qué le pasa a gran árbol?* [What's Wrong with Big Tree?], which she wrote. In her second presentation, “Let's talk about climate change with children while protecting their emotions”, the researcher conversed with parents about the importance of having tools for taking care of children's emotions when addressing the complex issue of climate change without conveying the idea of a catastrophic future. For her part, on Friday 22, Associate

Researcher Vania Martínez gave a presentation aimed at teachers at the Municipal Theater of Antofagasta on the subject “Mental health in adolescents: What can schools do?”. On Sunday 24, she gave the talk “Young people today: a snowflake generation?”, where she presented scientific evidence on the mental health of young university students, considering their most frequent problems, their causes, the influence of the pandemic, and some suggestions for tackling mental health issues.

On August 2, at Edulab UC, launched the book *¿Qué le pasa a gran árbol?* [What's Wrong with Big Tree?], written by Associate Researcher María Pía Santelices. Before an audience of 35 people plus some 90 more who viewed the event on-line, the book was discussed by Juan Pablo Jiménez, Sebastián Medeiros, Director and Young Researcher of the Institute respectively, and Neva Milicic, expert in child-adolescent psychology and children's literature. Published by Catalonia as part of an Outreach activity funded by the Millennium Program of the National Research and Development Agency (ANID), the document narrates the story of a tree that, in the middle of summer, is the only one losing its leaves and colors. The book talks about depression in a playful and fun way, using language similar to that of children, but also features more complex elements that can inform conversations with adults –such as the importance of connecting with one's emotions and mindfulness– all of which have been studied at the Institute.

Just like hybrid activities, fully on-line initiatives have also proven to greatly benefit connectivity and communication. With this in mind, on May 24, we held the on-line seminar “Conversations on mental health and sustainable development”. Open to all audiences, the seminar brought together three leading researchers from the fields of social science, economy, and biology who joined three panel discussions with MIDAP researchers and then conversed with the attendees. The first dialogue, entitled “Social excesses and individual ills”, featured Kathya Araujo, sociologist, psychologist, and Director of the Authority and Power Asymmetries Millennium Nucleus, and Cristian Montenegro, sociologist and Young Researcher at MIDAP. The second conversation, entitled “Searching for the boundaries of neoliberalism”, featured Rodrigo Valdés, former Minister of Finance and UC School of Government economist, and Álvaro Jiménez, Young Researcher at MIDAP. The third and final panel, entitled “Science in Chile: An unfinished experiment?”, featured Ramón Latorre, biochemist, recipient of the 2002 National Natural Sciences Award, and former director of the Interdisciplinary Neuroscience Center of Valparaíso (Millennium Institute), and Mariane Krause, Associate Researcher at MIDAP and Dean of the UC Faculty of Social Sciences. With over 400 views and 100 concurrent users, the seminar met its stated goal of being a general-interest event that contributed to the establishment of a much-needed conversation among social, economic, and mental health agents.

Several science communication activities allowed us to continue raising our profile among the general public and the media as a leading institution in the mental health field, including the production of an animated short entitled “Community spirit and mental health”. The video reveals how aspects such as inequality, low income, and unequal access to health care and education, among others, constitute social determinants of mental health, since they have an impact on our individual and collective well-being (<https://midap.org/videos-psicoeducativos/>).

From October 2 to 9, MIDAP participated in the 2022 Science Festival (FECI) through two podcasts, one on climate change with Associate Researcher María Pía Santelices and another about eco-anxiety with Young Researcher Stefanella Costa. Both productions are in line with the central topic of the festival: regeneration and climate change. Focusing on water, the podcasts covered the third core theme of the event, resilience and adaptation.

In parallel to these science communication activities, and making use of fresh funding received in October from Milenio-ANID through the 2022 Outreach competitive grants which enabled us to organize events during the second semester, we implemented the second version of the campaign “Take Care of Your Mental Health!”. This initiative was launched on October 24 through the digital platforms of the Santiago

Metro system and the social media accounts of the entities that developed it: Psiconecta, UC, and MIDAP. The objective of this ongoing campaign is to provide Santiago Metro users with information about four specific mental health topics (work relations, parenting skills, sexual-affective relationships, and school climate) through educational videos. This visual material is complemented with written pieces about each topic, plus other videos produced by MIDAP and which are hosted on the web platform www.cuidatusaludmental.cl and on the Institute's website. All this material is shared on the social media channels of both entities. Furthermore, we continued working on the digital and print edition of the book *Mental Health and Society in a Time of Crisis*, a product generated in accordance with the Outreach funding plan approved in October 2021. The book will be made available for free on the main e-book sites (EBooks Patagonia, Amazon, Apple Books, Google Books) in March 2023.

It is also worth noting that, as of this writing, MIDAP has 11,661 followers on Facebook, 5,247 on Instagram, 1,923 on Twitter, and 1,249 on LinkedIn, as well as 2,740 YouTube subscribers.

- b) Connections with other sectors:** Most of the connections established in previous years have been maintained over time, while new ones have been generated across multiple levels. Thus, the participation of MIDAP researchers in a number of public and private initiatives, either as collaborators, consultants, or service providers, has continued to cement our place as leaders in mental health research in Chile and, in certain areas, also internationally. Some of these connections are mentioned below, while the complete list is in Annex 8.

With respect to public agencies, MIDAP researchers have continued to collaborate with various institutions and bodies. For instance, Mariane Krause finished her collaboration as a member of the Advisory Council of the Ministry of Science, Technology, Knowledge, and Innovation in September 2022. Diego Cosmelli, Adjunct Researcher, was a member of the Technical Advisory Committee established by the Human Capital Department, National Research and Development Agency (ANID), which is part of the same Ministry, to advise on matters such as requests for tenders, rulings, terms and conditions, and other topics related to the funding instruments and initiatives of this Department. Associate Researcher Luis Salazar continues to be part of the Fondecyt G2-G3 Medicine panel (ANID). Furthermore, MIDAP is a collaborative institution of the PAR EXPLORA South West Metropolitan Region, financed by the Science and Society Division, Ministry of Science, Technology, Knowledge, and Innovation.

Regarding the human health sector, Young Researcher Álvaro Jiménez and Associate Researcher Vania Martínez participated in the regional commission on suicide prevention of the Metropolitan Region Department, Ministry of Health (MINSAL), to coordinate initiatives aimed at fulfilling the objectives of the National Suicide Prevention Program. Adjunct Researcher Susana Morales collaborated with the National Suicide Prevention Program, MINSAL to evaluate the design of suicide prevention training programs for community facilitators. In the same sector, Adjunct Researcher Matías Irrázaval headed a committee for the co-construction of the Ministry of Health's National Mental Health and Human Rights Strategy. Finally, Associate Researcher Claudia Miranda participated in the Regional Technical Bureau of Dementia, MINSAL.

Toward the end of the year, MIDAP provided a hybrid-mode service for training 400 suicide prevention monitors. Beneficiaries include professionals, educators, tutors, and monitors of accredited collaborators and collaborators directly affiliated with the National Agency for the Specialized Protection of Children and Adolescents (Ministry of Social Development and Family) who conduct interventions for children and adolescents and their families, in all regions of Chile and across all relevant programs. As part of the training services delivered by Associate Researcher Vania Martínez and Young Researcher Álvaro Jiménez, under the coordination of MIDAP's Executive Director and Adjunct Researcher, Susana Maldonado, two seminars were held (in Santiago and Valparaíso) and one psychoeducational video was produced. These activities were commissioned to MIDAP through a public request for tenders through the Mercado Público system.

With respect to universities and research centers, some existing ties have been preserved and new ones have been generated. Pía Santelices is still leading the collaboration agreements with the Child Welfare Program of the Universidad Católica del Maule and the School of Psychology of the Universidad Católica del Norte (UCN); plus, she is heading the agreements signed with the School of Psychology of the Universidad Católica del Norte (UCN) and the Observatory of Childhood and Youth of the Antofagasta Region. Associate Researcher Luis Salazar has continued to collaborate internally with UFRO, serving on various bodies such as UFRO's Committee of Graduate Affairs and Medical Specializations and the Continuous Quality Improvement Team, Doctoral Program in Sciences (specialization in Applied Cellular and Molecular Biology), and as a member of the Advisory Board on the Accreditation of Graduate Programs for the National Accreditation Commission. Young Researcher Cecilia de la Cerda served as Coordinator of the line Mental Health with a territorial focus of the Psychosocial Observatory in Emergency Situations of the Universidad de Playa Ancha (OPSE-UPLA). Adjunct Researcher Diego Cosmelli is president of the Graduate Advisory Commission of the Council of Presidents of Chilean Universities (CRUCH). Associate Researcher Claudia Miranda is part of the Advisory Committee "Inter-University Center for Healthy Aging" (CIES), which belongs to the Consortium of State Universities. Finally, MIDAP is still collaborating with several research centers that are conducting longitudinal studies based on the results of the Longitudinal Social Study of Chile (ELSOC) and the Longitudinal Study of Intercultural Relationships (ELRI) (especially COES and CIIR).

At an international level, Young Researcher Cristian Montenegro collaborated with the World Health Organization (WHO) on the preparation of the 2021 World Mental Health Report, while Adjunct Researcher Matías Irrázaval is the head of the Regional High-Level Commission on Mental Health and COVID-19 (Pan-American Health Organization/WHO), a strategic group composed of leaders and intellectuals from the Americas that helps the Organization and Member States to improve and strengthen mental health across the region, both during the pandemic and in the future. Associate Researcher Claudia Miranda is part of the international expert advisory group on the project Living Alone with Cognitive Impairment (LACI), University of California, USA. Luis Salazar, Associate Researcher, is an evaluator of research projects submitted to the Biology and Medicine Division, Swiss National Science Foundation, Switzerland.

c) Other achievements: Nothing to report during 2022.

7. Administration and Financial Status

- a) **Organization and administration:** All the administrative tasks and internal meetings of the MIDAP Institute continued to be held remotely throughout 2022.

The Council of Associate and Senior Researchers² holds its monthly meetings on Zoom. As is already known, the tasks of the Council include organizing and coordinating all the scientific-academic activities of the Institute; actively participating in a variety of research activities held each year; making decisions about the promotion of researchers belonging to the Institute; defining the rules of some internal tenders and selecting their beneficiaries; and making strategic decisions about the research conducted at the institute, among other tasks. Since 2021, the MIDAP Council has made increasing efforts to define the objectives and goals of the Institute if its funding is renewed for another 10 years through a competitive grant to be conducted by Milenio-ANID in late 2024, as permitted by the terms and conditions of the original competitive grant awarded to MIDAP.

MIDAP's Management Team, which executes the decisions of its leaders and Council (see previous Annual Reports) continued holding weekly internal remote meetings. The make-up of the team remained unchanged relative to last year, as shown in the following diagram.



The various studies led by a MIDAP researcher have a team composed of other researchers and research assistants, some of whom receive payment through MSI funds for part-time staff. The other research assistants are supported through external funds provided through additional research projects led by MIDAP researchers. Regardless of the origin of the funds that they receive as payment for their work, research assistants are a relevant part of the Institute's community and, as such, they are encouraged to participate in all the research meetings held annually by MIDAP.

MIDAP depended on six Host Institutions (see Introduction). In terms of infrastructure and administrative duties, our Institute primarily relies on the support of UC's School of Psychology (EPUC). General facilities provided by all Host Institutions include work spaces for the researchers and students involved in each project; library services; meeting rooms; clerical assistants; phone and Internet connection; video conferencing equipment; software for quantitative and qualitative statistical analysis; and other general services. During 2022, the collaboration of Universidad Diego Portales and Universidad de Valparaíso gained relevance, since they hosted a range of in-person activities organized by MIDAP.

- b) **Financial Status:** The Institute received the full payment of its ninth financial contribution from the MSI by early July 2022 (approx. US\$331,561), a slightly larger amount in Chilean pesos than the previous year, but equivalent to a 13% smaller dollar amount relative to 2021. Additionally, the MSI contributed with US\$ 10,518 for Outreach activities, a 55% budget decrease compared with the funding allocated in 2021. Despite these economic constraints, we were able to maintain most of the planned activities.

MIDAP has continued receiving some financial support from ANID (approximately US\$13,786), allocated through FONDECYT for three research projects conducted by MIDAP researchers, together with other grants obtained from various sources, like the funds awarded by Botnar Foundation, Switzerland (US\$ 50,792). In 2022, we received another grant of CLP\$10,000,000 (approx. US\$10,518) from the Vice-President's Office for Research of Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile to support the training of postdoctoral researchers (more details in section 4). In addition, we received a payment of US\$ 105,300 for a scientific consultancy commissioned by DUOC, and US\$38,515 for a training consultancy commissioned the Mejor Niñez Service. Finally, we received an additional US\$16,100 from some training programs offered annually by MIDAP.

The outflow structure for the year 2022 followed the same pattern of past years, with most of the MSI income being spent on researchers' and students' salaries and bonuses, internal research grants, research assistants' salaries, partial support for publications, and small contributions for attending scientific events, among other elements.

Our Institute has experienced significant challenges related to the broader funding scheme and specific funding decisions by the Millennium Initiative. First, it is important to notice that MIDAP was one of the first Social Science Institutes awarded. At the time there was a major and arbitrary difference in the funds assigned to Social Sciences versus Natural Sciences Institutes. This arbitrary difference has not been corrected over the years for MIDAP. For new Institutes the difference is less now, but for MIDAP it has meant a smaller budget which actually decreases every year because it is a lump sum not adjusted for inflation. Thus, MIDAP is always struggling to produce relevant outcomes with a fraction of the budget allocated to Natural Sciences Institutes or to Social Sciences Institutes awarded later by the program and with funds actually diminishing every year because of inflation.

MIDAP has received Ch\$288,000,000 annually since 2015, with no annual adjustment for inflation, which meant that in 2022, our budget was approximately 40% less than in our first year of operation. Additionally, because of budget constraints within the Millennium Initiative, in 2022 we received less funds for outreach, but in addition, due to the competition rules, it was possible to propose only 2 activities to be carried out during that period.

In terms of productivity, there was an attempt to impose a change regarding the information that we must report annually to Millennium, restricting it to only those products developed by Principal Investigators and Young Researchers. Obviously, this change would have a quite negative effect on the figures reported by MIDAP for 2022. Fortunately, and after subsequent meetings with the Milenio management team, this change was dropped.

On the other hand, the imposition of almost absurd rules and excessive bureaucracy to render certain expenses has made it very difficult to finance activities and products of the work developed by research centers, which previously could be financed without such a problem.

During 2022 there were many changes in institutional scientific policies with changes in the Ministry and uncertainty regarding renewal policies for Institutes and gaps between the funding period for MIDAP and the new call for renovation. This was rather problematic because during 2022 significant work was done preparing for a competitive renewal process in the absence of any clarity about the instruments, time-lines and budgets that were relevant to think about our Institute's continuity.
